
Dwight Howard: A Superstar in the World of Basketball

NBA Career

Howard was selected first overall by the Orlando Magic in the 2004 NBA Draft. He quickly became one of the most dominant centers in the league, averaging 12.0 points, 10.0 rebounds, and 1.7 blocks per game as a rookie. 
