  - Ignores the political grievances of these movements...
    - Despite the successful European experience of political solutions!
  - Can terrorism be defeated by force, does it create new recruits?
- Political initiatives: US: traditional and cultural diplomacy to secure allies (9/11 exhibition)
- Legal: Civil liberties
  - E.g. USA: Patriot Act, Guantanamo Bay and torture scandals
  - Dilemma of choosing between 'personal freedom' and 'security'..., Pakistan's Anti- Terrorism Act, 1997., U.K's Terrorism Act, 2000 & 2006.
  - ME authoritarian states have been encouraged to crack down on any opposition they consider terrorist!


As the Bolsheviks consolidated their power, they faced the dilemma of whether to use terror to quell opposition or seek reconciliation with their adversaries. 


